AMAZING GRACE

J. B. S. Haldane, biologist, judges that the universe is not only stranger than we suppose, but that it is stranger than we can imagine. Put another way, our physical universe sometimes defies human logic.

Little wonder, then, that God sometimes acts in ways that challenge our narrow minds. In the First Reading today, God says:

"...my thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are not your ways..." Danger for small minds: to demand that God should think and act according to our standards. God is not in trial. We are.

In Jesus' parable about recruitment and payment of casual labourers in a Palestinian vineyard what appears unjust by labour-market calculation, is, in fact, remarkably generous. All the workers receive a fair wage, and some a very generous one. "Why be envious because I am generous".

That is how God acts. We call it "grace".



FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Isaiah

GOSPEL

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples:

The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage". So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too".

In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first". So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat."

He answered one of them and said,

"My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?"
