GOD IN WHAT HAPPENS

During the COVID pandemic there was a short video which went 'viral' that showed a young man entering a supermarket and going to the hand sanitizer at the entrance. He then blessed himself with it and went off to do his shopping! The video has been viewed by many thousands of people and although it was probably watched as a bit of fun it also brought a message reminding people that God's protection was just as necessary as hand sanitizer as people continued through an anxious and testing time. God works in many ways — even modern technology — to remind us each day of his care for us even through the hands of those who don't necessarily believe in him or his message. In the first reading today the prophet Isaiah describes the pagan king Cyrus as God's anointed. But Cyrus didn't worship God and certainly didn't credit God for his success or prosperity and yet Isaiah says that God used the king to free his people and to restore the holy city of Jerusalem. So, God uses many strategies and sometimes unlikely people such as Cyrus — or me or you to accomplish his mission.

It's almost a hundred years since Pope Pius XI set aside this day, called Mission Sunday so that every diocese, parish, religious community, association and ecclesial movement throughout the world would pray for and support missionaries and Christian communities in need. There have been tens of thousands of Irish missionaries who have given their lives happily in the service of the missions; they have brought education, health care and the fight for social justice to almost every country we can think of. Some of them have been killed or lost their health and all of them have left the known and familiar to bring the story of God's mercy, the good news that is the Gospel to some of the poorest people on earth. As Pope Francis has said, 'as they travel through the streets of the world, the disciples of Jesus need to have a love without limits, the same measure of love that our Lord has for all people.' And God is always lending us a hand.

MISSION SUNDAY - THIS WEEKEND

Missio is the Pope's official charity for overseas mission, and assists the Church's evangelising work in places where missioners strive to bring the good news of Jesus Christ, so often in situations and circumstances which are difficult, isolated, impoverished or dangerous. A reading from the book of Isaiah

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings,

that I have called you by your name,

conferring a title though you do not know me.

Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?

But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius and he said, 'Whose head is

this? Whose name?'

'Caesar's' they replied.

He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.' The Gospel of the Lord.
