GOD'S POWER IN US, RESISTING ALL EVIL FORCES

Introduction

In families it is important to show children how to practice virtues, and be good citizens. From the earliest years it is also common to warn children to avoid such things as crossing a busy road, or walking among wild animals. Likewise, in the totality of Catholic life, we cultivate a strong spiritual living, and absolute opposition to all evil and the devil's influence.

Today's texts

The story of Adam and Eve and their disobedience to God shows the ruthless trickery of the devil (Genesis 3). The Gospel (Mark 3) paints a scene of Jesus being accused by the Jewish leaders; they say he is possessed by Beelzebul (the devil). Jesus confounds the devil — and his adversaries. Our Church Catechism says that devils are bad angels (led by Satan), who rebelled against God, and seeks to lead the human race away from God to eternal damnation. The 2nd Reading (2 Corinthians 4, 5) gives us the positive treasure of a living faith, esteemed, loved, and practiced. This is secure protection against all evil and sin. The Gospel ends with a most consoling picture of Mary and close disciples of Jesus.

Practical reflections

The living reality for each of us in the mutual support of a faith-community is most valuable. We oppose the deceits of Satan. In our doctrine, while we are aware of diabolical activity and are always most cautious, yet we are not obsessed by the evil one. We are careful to avoid the spirits of evil; we avoid superstition, spells, oujia boards, séances, astrology, horoscopes; the first Commandment also forbids us to support pagan rites. God alone is to be worshipped. Only God knows the future, while ordinary science and good observation offer clues which are helpful. We trust God in everything.

Our pure Church teaching gives us the grace of the Holy Trinity and the freedom of truth.

A reading from the Book of Genesis

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture —I believed, and therefore I spoke — we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weigh little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

For we know that when the tent that we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind. The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him,' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.'

So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house. I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.' His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'
