WHAT DO YOU WANT?

Blindness, whether from birth or in later life, is an enormous physical disability. In the bible, blindness is sometimes a symbol of spiritual disability.

Today, a blind man, Bartimaeus sits and begs for a few coppers at the roadside.

He hears a commotion, a crowd, then that it's Jesus of Nazareth!

Bartimaeus is pretty smart, grabs the moment

"Son of David" he shouts, "have pity on me".

The crowd tries to shush Bartimaeus; he won't shut up;

"Son of David, have pity on me".

Jesus calls Bartimaeus – who throws off his only possession, his cloak; Jesus asks: "what do you want me to do for you?" Is that a dumb question to ask?

Bartimaeus needed his eyesight, his life restored; he needed salvation.

Notice Bartimaeus' CLOAK; possibly his only possession. He could have held on to his cloak, lest it be stolen.

That cloak might have kept him from Jesus; he might have missed this opportunity.

Bartimaeus was too smart to squander this chance.

Throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus; "Master, let me see again".

Immediately his sight returned and he followed Jesus in the Way. Not only his physical sight, but his spiritual sight returned too. Bartimaeus followed in the Way of Jesus.

Today Jesus asks you: "What do you want me to do for you"?

A vital question, not a dumb question.

First, do you know what you want from Jesus?

Then, have you courage to ask for what you want?

Finally, do you believe that Jesus can and will give you what you want?

St Ignatius of Loyola: before I pray I will ask God for what I want and need.
