Transfiguration in the Eucharist

The great mystery of our faith

While preparing this reflection for the second Sunday of Lent, I recalled an experience I had many years ago when, I attended an evening Mass at home. The Mass followed a removal service for someone who had died in the parish. As I was approaching the altar that evening, to receive Holy Communion, I became aware of an overwhelming sense of the presence of God in all who had gathered to pray. It seemed to me that Jesus was saying to me, I am here, I am risen from the dead; those who die will rise with me. In the deepest part of myself, in that moment, I knew this to be true.

In today's gospel story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, Peter, James and John had an extraordinary experience of the divinity of Jesus. Up until then they had known Jesus only in human form but at the transfiguration, 'His appearance changed dramatically...His face shone with heavenly glory, clear and bright like the sun and His clothing became white as light'. (Matt 17:2) . Later John was to write, 'We have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only'. (John Chapter 1 verse 14).

The Transfiguration story is mirrored in the Eucharist's power to transform us. Just as the disciples were changed by encountering Christ's glory, we too are transformed when we take part in celebrating the Sacred Mystery of the Lord's passion death and resurrection. The Eucharist is for each of us a channel of grace, which has the power to renew and cleanse us, drawing us more deeply into a relationship of love with Jesus.

St.Louise de Marillac, was struggling to know what path to follow in her life. She too had a 'transfiguration moment' while attending Mass, on Pentecost Sunday 1623. During Mass on that day, all her doubts and fears about her future, were dispelled by a revelation of the Holy Spirit. She wrote this Pentecost experience on parchment and carried it with her as a reminder that despite her difficulties, God was guiding her life. She would eventually establish the Company of the Daughters of Charity with St. Vincent de Paul.

The highlight of our faith is the Eucharist in which Jesus reveals Himself to us in His word and in the Sacrament of Himself. As we journey through Lent, let us appreciate more deeply, this great gift of our faith.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Genesis

Taking Abram outside the Lord said,

'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him.

Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.
