Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion: 13 April 2025

The readings for Palm Sunday tell us the story of Jesus' last week from his entry into Jerusalem, his institution of the Eucharist and his passion and death. But they tell us more than that. They are a reflection on the essence of who Jesus is, and on his relationship with the Father. In the midst of the horrific story of his crucifixion, we find loyal-ty, fidelity and the deepest of love.

The second reading from Philippians is an ancient Christian hymn from the very early church, which was incorporated into the letter. We are used to the story of the incarnation in Luke's gospel but this hymn gives us an insight into a much earlier understanding of the incarnation. It presents us with Jesus whose state was divine, emptying himself to assume the condition of a slave. This is Jesus who, though Lord and Master, washed the feet of his disciples.

Humility is the total acceptance of who I am before God. It allows me to take my place as a disciple called to service. It opens my heart to be filled with God's love and to be a vessel through which he pours his love into the world. It allows me to be the hands and feet voice and heart which makes the reign of God present today.

The Philippians canticle brings the note of hope, of resurrection into today's liturgy. God raised him high - the outcome of Jesus true humility. Now we can recognise him as he truly is: Christ and Lord.
