

Dublin's Oldest Charity

Founded in 1790 for the relief of the poor, **The Sick and Indigent Roomkeepers Society**

Society is Dublin's oldest charity. Now in its 225 year, it continues to respond to the needs of the poor without distinction of religion, race or creed. The problems addressed include severe poverty, drug abuse, inability to meet basic utility costs, lack of heating, lighting, furnishings and very often, lack of food. The people most affected by this are the most vulnerable in our society - children, the elderly and those who are physically or mentally incapacitated. Despite reduced income in recent years the Society provides some financial assistance to all qualifying applications received. Apart from one part-time employee, all Trustees work on a voluntary basis, which ensures that your money goes to where it is needed most. Their annual collection will be held at all Masses this weekend. It replaces the usual Share collection.
