To be compared with sheep does not appear much of a compliment; sheep have a reputation for being over-docile, following each other snout-to-tail in an uncritical fashion. There are even those who maintain that speaking of God's people as sheep has had, over the centuries, the effect of stifling initiative among lay people. But are these negative gualities of sheep, whether real or alleged the ones Jesus had in mind? Indeed not. First and foremost for Jesus, the shepherd enjoys a kind of instinctive communication with his sheep. It's an acquired capacity to read little signals or symptoms, so that the shepherd has a sense of what the sheep want and more importantly, need.

We all have a desire to be known: to be perfectly, intimately, known. We want someone else to understand our fears and anxieties, and to witness and share our joys and happiness. But - and this is a very large 'but' in-
