Our God is there to save



## ALL SAINTS DAY

### FOR ALL THE SAINTS

*In the early church, Christians who died a martyr's death were considered Saints. Every year, on their anniversaries, Christians would say Mass at their tombs. This practice grew to include remembering other outstanding Christians on the days they died. In the ninth century, November 1 became the day to remember all the Saints living in God's presence.*

#### No further from us than God...

The Saints can seem remote from our lives and the stuffy way they are presented can be off-putting. This is a pity because at its best, our devotion to the Saints is like that of having advisors who are all the more credible because they have walked our road, experienced all our weaknesses, and not been overcome by them. They are witnesses that this life in God is possible and reversals should never lead us to giving up.

#### It takes all sorts

There are Saints who were "good" from childhood, and those who lived dreadful lives before coming round, there are Saints who worked out their holiness on the world stage and those whose virtues were acquired in such "small" settings that people barely no-

ted their extraordinary inner life. There were Saints who were loved by all 'round them and those who set their neighbours teeth on edge. Most importantly there are Saints who have never been acknowledged at all, but are now living in God's presence.

#### The Communion of Saints

There are the Saints we celebrate this week, thanking God for the hope they give the rest of us and also for their continued involvement with us in the Communion of the Saints. It is this Communion perhaps which is the most consoling aspect of the devotion to the Saints. Even in the presence of God they still care about the rest of us, stumbling along the road to salvation. When we pray to them, study their lives, try to follow their example, they are looking down roaring their support for our most feeble efforts and rejoicing at the smallest success.

On Friday, we celebrate that special relationship with the Saints with a Holy Day. It gives us the opportunity to rejoice with them at their arrival in the place prepared for all of us and the encouragement to stay, or even get back, on track, and above all to receive in the Mass the food that made their victory possible, and will do the same for each and every one of us.


