What's my wilderness experience?

"I'm A Celebrity Get Me Out Of Here" on Virgin Media One at the moment is an evening viewing favourite of many people. It places a number of celebrities into a jungle camp and gets them to undertake gruelling and unpleasant tasks to win food and treats for themselves over a three week period. As it gets closer to finishing, the public get the opportunity to vote out their least favourite celebs.

As the celebrities are voted out they are interviewed by the show presenters. Many of those who are voted out talk about their experience in the jungle with their campmates. They inevitably speak about how being away from loved ones was emotionally hard, having no food left them hungry and lack of sleep had them energy-less. Every-time, however, they say that the experience has changed them and their outlook on life. One camp mate even called it a "wilderness experience".

"Why on earth would you do it?" many people ask as they watch it. But let's take another look. Many of the participants want to get away, want to challenge themselves, want to move from their comfort zones, want to get to know themselves better, want a deeper experience of self.

The Gospel today presents to us a "wilderness experience". The Baptist John moves to the wilderness to preach about the proximity of the Kingdom. There, as he preaches, the multitudes come to share his "wilderness experience". While

there, they are immersed in the Jordan as a preparation for the new future of the Kingdom of God. They go away from the experience knowing about themselves, John, God and the Kingdom.

Just as with John they wanted to know more about themselves and their relationship with God, they came from one way of life and returned different people. So, too do the celebrities in the jungle arrive a certain type of person and leave a different individual because they have encountered something bigger than themselves.

This Advent do we have a "wilderness experience?" Where do we go to get to know ourselves and in turn get to know God? Advent time is quickly becoming a time for the externals of the Christmas Season to be shown off, getting tangled up in Christmas tree lights, judging which shop has the nicest mince pies and groping for half-price Santas in DIY stores. What about the internal conversation I have with myself and God as we prepare for the celebration of the Incarnation? Does that get a look in?

Although we are not celebs we might have our own "I'm a Parishioner let me stay here" as we enter into our own "wilderness experience" over Advent and stay there until December 25th to greet the Child Jesus afresh and anew; coming away a bit different than the person we were on December 1st.

Let this be the first gift your family opens on Christmas, when together you place your Baby Jesus in the crib.




