GOD'S FIRE INFLAMES US

When I read about, and see people who are filled with faith and active love of God and people, I feel a real desire to do better. Good people living a sound holy life in the Church somehow send out sparks of goodness that set others ablaze. Holiness becomes infectious. Ultimately no one complains, because a full life of keeping the Commandments and following closely the teaching of the Church amounts to good news, not only for the Catholic Church members but for many more. St Paul once said effectively that there is no law against real virtue. Christ in the Gospel speaks of his message as a fire that can transform all people; though he also concedes that not everybody accepts his call to live the life of the Church. In the first reading Jeremiah's integrity is a warm glow from his prison cell and deep pit of mud. The young Ethiopian slave boy who pleads for the prophet's release offers the warmth of hope in a cold atmosphere. Fire is a figure associated with God's presence and action from the burning bush of Exodus 3 to the tongues of fire at Pentecost (Acts 2). The second reading (from Hebrews) portrays Christ as completing and sealing our salvation. This inspires us all, his followers to imitate his offering. The Mystic's "living flame of love" is a burning incentive to all to enjoy a full life in the Faith.

LITURGICAL READINGS FOR: Sunday, 14 August 2022

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of the Prophet Jeremiah

The king's leading men spoke to the king.

'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.'

'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered *'for the king is powerless against you.'*

So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank. Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order:

'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'
